

Undergraduate EU Entry Scholarships

General Terms and Conditions

1. Definitions and Interpretation

1.1 Eligibility Criteria means all the conditions which you must meet in order to receive the Scholarship and which are set out in Clause 2.

1.2 Event outside our control: is defined in clause 9.

1.3 You/Your: means the person who registers for a Scholarship upon application under these terms and conditions;

1.4 We/Our/Us: The University of East Anglia, having its administrative offices at Norwich Research Park, Norwich, NR4 7TJ.

1.5 Unless the context otherwise requires the singular includes the plural and the masculine includes the feminine and vice versa. Clause headings are for reference only and shall not be taken into consideration in interpretation.

2. Eligibility Criteria

2.1 You are eligible for an Undergraduate EU Entry Scholarship under these Terms if you meet all these criteria:

2.1.1 You are an EU citizen (except citizens of the United Kingdom). You are not eligible for this scholarship if you are a citizen of the Channel Islands or Isle of Man or an International citizen. Other scholarships are available for International and UK citizens, details can be found at www.uea.ac.uk/study/international/fees-and-funding/scholarships

2.1.2 You are enrolling on your first undergraduate degree course, including courses with a Foundation Year and Dip HE Operating Department Practice, in September 2017 or January 2018.

2.1.3 You are enrolled and attending as a student at the University at the time of payment.

2.1.6 You achieve the grades specified in one of the following sets of qualifications:

- AAA at A level (excluding General Studies A Level).
 - A levels in Critical Thinking or a native Language will only be considered for an Entry Scholarship if included as part of the conditions of an offer. A level General Studies is not considered for the Entry Scholarship
 - A* grades are treated as A grades for scholarship purposes.
 - Additional AS qualifications and the Extended Project Qualification are not considered for the Entry Scholarship
- 34 points from International Baccalaureate
- AAAAAA from Irish Leaving Certificate;
- 14 from French Baccalaureate;
- 95% from Italian Diploma di Esame;
- 1.4 from German Abitur;
- 5.6 from Bulgarian Diploma za Sredno Obrazovanie
- 19.5 from Greek or Cypriot Apolytirion;
- 9 from Lithuanian Brandos Atestatas
- 9 from Dutch Voorereidend Wetenschappelijk Onderwijs

- 8 from Belgian Certificat d'Enseignement Secondaire Superieur or Diploma van Hoger Secundair Onderwijs
- 9 from Latvian Atestas par Visparejo Videjo Izglitibu
- 9 from Romanian Diploma de Bacalaureat
- 8.5 from Spanish Curso de Orientacio or Titulo de Bachillerato
- 85% from European Baccalaureate.

Other European qualifications or UK/EU citizens taking international qualifications will be automatically considered on a case by case basis by the University.

2.1.7 You have selected UEA as your firm choice institution via your initial application to UEA.

2.2 Eligible Programmes

2.2.1 Scholarships may be offered by us in respect of credit-bearing undergraduate taught programmes awarded by us.

3. Our Agreement with you

3.1 These are the terms in accordance with which you apply for a Scholarship as part of your enrolment on an Eligible Programme and in accordance with which we grant you a Scholarship, if any.

3.2 If successful, you will be registered and enrolled with us as a full-time or part-time undergraduate student for a credit-bearing undergraduate programme under our Degree Regulations set out in the University Calendar. You must abide by our Charter, Statutes, Ordinances, Regulations and Policies in force from time to time.

3.3 Please ensure you read these Terms carefully. These Terms will become binding on you and us when you click the register for discount box as part of application procedure.

3.4 We may make changes to these Terms from time to time and the version that is applicable to you will be those that were in force at the date of your first enrolment with us.

4. The Process

4.1 If you meet the Eligibility Criteria payment of the EU Entry Scholarship will be automatic. You do not need to make a separate application.

4.2 Provided we are satisfied that you meet our Eligibility Criteria and achieve the specified grades, we will pay your £1000 Scholarship to your nominated account as a one off payment in the February of the first year of your course. It is your responsibility to ensure that the University is advised of any changes to your bank account details.

4.3 Part time students who study a minimum of 25% full time equivalent (fte) may be eligible for an EU Entry scholarship. Any support given will be proportional to tuition fee paid.

4.4 If we are of the reasonable view that you do not meet our Eligibility Criteria and you wish to appeal we will ask you to provide us with such proof as we deem necessary to make this assessment. You must supply us with the requested evidence as soon as reasonably possible.

4.5 If we are satisfied that you have met all the Eligibility Criteria we will pay the Scholarship to your nominated account as set out in clause 4.2 above. However, if we remain of the view that you still do not meet our Eligibility Criteria, we will advise you of this in writing.

4.6 Only one UEA Scholarship will be paid to eligible students. If you have been successful in achieving more than one Scholarship at the University, for example a 'Difference Scholarship' you will be able to request which one you would prefer to receive.

5. The EU Entry Scholarship Scheme

5.1 We have complete discretion to decide how long we will make this Scholarship scheme available for, for what period of time the Scholarship scheme will operate and may withdraw the Scholarship scheme at any time and without further notice.

5.2 We may cease offering the Scholarship scheme at any time and in our complete discretion.

5.3 The EU Entry Scholarship is an automatic payment of £1000 for one year only, providing eligibility criteria is met.

6. Removal and Repayment of a Scholarship

6.1 We may remove the Scholarship immediately in the event that:

6.1.1 You withdraw from your programme of study; or

6.1.2 You are expelled, suspended or excluded from the whole or part of the University or your programme of study for academic failure; or

6.1.3 We are of the reasonable opinion that you have made any misrepresentation (whether negligently or intentionally) to us either in respect of applying for the Scholarship or during the course of and in connection with your studies at the University; or

6.1.4 We are of the reasonable opinion that you have acted fraudulently or dishonestly in connection with securing your Scholarship or place at the University.

6.2 In addition to requiring repayment in accordance with clause 7 below, in any of the circumstances set out in clause 6.1.2 or 6.1.3 above, we may also take such action against you as is permitted under our Student Disciplinary Procedures or Fitness to Study Policy which are set out and available from the University Calendar at www.uea.ac.uk/calendar

6.3 In the event of an intercalation, payment will be suspended until you return and progress to the next stage of your course.

7. Repayment of the Scholarship

7.1 In the event that your Scholarship is removed in the circumstances set out in clause 6 above, you will be liable to pay us the monetary amount equating to your Scholarship, immediately on demand.

7.2 If we have made an error in calculating your Scholarship and as a result you have received any funds to which you were not entitled, we may request that you repay us the amount overpaid and you will be liable to repay it to us within 30 days of our demand.

7.3 In addition to any other rights we may have at law to take action against you for recovery or repayment of the amount equating to the Scholarship, the amount so outstanding will be treated by us as a sum due to us and, in accordance with our General Regulations on Fees and Charges, may mean that you will not be awarded your degree until you have made payment to us as requested.

8. Marketing and Promotion

8.1 You may be required, to make yourself available on reasonable notice, for any publicity and marketing campaigns we want to run in connection with the Undergraduate EU Entry Scholarship Scheme, which may include but not be limited to public appearances, speeches, photographs, blogging and/tweeting or interviews.

9. Events outside our control

9.1 We will not be liable or responsible for any failure to perform, or delay in performance of, any of our obligations under these Terms that is caused by an event outside our control.

9.2 An event outside our control means any act or event beyond our reasonable control, including without limitation strikes, lock-outs or other industrial action by third parties, civil commotion, riot, invasion, terrorist attack or threat of terrorist attack, war (whether declared or not) or threat or preparation for war, fire, explosion, storm, flood, earthquake, subsidence, epidemic or other natural disaster, or failure of public or private telecommunications networks.

9.3 If an event outside our control takes place that affects our performance of an on-going obligations under these Terms:

9.3.1 We will contact you as soon as reasonably possible to notify you; and

9.3.2 Our obligations under these Terms will be suspended and the time for performance of our obligations will be extended for the duration of the event outside our control.

10. How we may use your personal information

10.1 We will use the personal information you provide to us to administer the Scholarship scheme. We will retain all documents we receive in connection with the Scholarship scheme along with your other student records in accordance with our Data Protection Policy:

11. Other Important Terms

11.1 We may transfer our rights and obligations under these Terms to another organisation, and we will always notify you in writing if this happens, but this will not affect your rights or our obligations under these Terms.

11.2 No other person shall have any rights to enforce any of the terms of this Scholarship scheme.

11.3 Each of the paragraphs of these Terms operates separately. If any court or relevant authority decides that any of them are unlawful, the remaining paragraphs will remain in full force and effect.

11.4 If we fail to insist that you perform any of your obligations under these Terms, or if we do not enforce our rights against you, or if we delay in doing so, that will not mean that we have waived our rights against you and will not mean that you do not have to comply with those obligations. If we do waive a default by you, we will only do so in writing, and that will not mean that we will automatically waive any later default by you.

11.5 These terms together with your Scholarship and UCAS application form contain the whole agreement between us in relation to the operation of the Undergraduate EU Entry Scholarship Scheme.

11.6 These Terms are governed by English law. You and we both agree to submit to the exclusive jurisdiction of the English courts.
