# “What can we learn from the development of Community based Rehabilitation (CBR) Programmes in China?”

### Seminar Presentation 1-2pm

China is committed to introducing and developing CBR to broaden access to rehabilitation, education and employment for disabled people. The Kadoorie Foundation’s latest CBR project, in partnership with the Chinese Government, was the focus of an evaluation which will be described in this presentation. The evaluation was based on information gathered from 113 people: 39 disabled people and 14 disabled people’s family members, 11 specialist professionals, 19 county government representatives and 29 community workers. With the participation of those attending the presentation, the evaluation will be examined in relation to the situation in the UK.

### Brief Biography

Emeritus Professor Sally Hartley was the first professor to be appointed to the School of Allied Health Professions at UEA in 2006. She also holds professorial positions at The London School of Hygiene and Tropical Medicine and University of Sydney, Australia. She was instrumental in initiating tangible advances in the field of CBR. Her impact is underpinned by her work with the CBR Africa Network (CAN), of which she was a founder member and Executive Director for 10 years. She was a major contributor to the WHO guidelines on CBR and co-editor and contributor to the WHO’s first World Report on Disability. Tens of thousands of print and download copies of both these publications, are now in circulation worldwide.
