Four Scholarships are available to students applying to the INTO University of East Anglia Foundation pathway in **Humanities and Law** leading to selected undergraduate courses at the University of East Anglia in the following Schools of Study:

- American Studies
- Film and Television Studies
- Music
- Philosophy
- Political, Social and International Studies
- World Art Studies and Museology

The INTO Foundation programmes commence on 27 September 2010 and 10 January 2011. Successful completion of the appropriate Foundation programme (subject to meeting specified grades for entry) guarantees students' progression on a wide range of undergraduate degree courses

Value of award	£ 10,500
Who is eligible?	Applicants from non-EU countries are invited to apply for these scholarships. They need to have completed 12 years of schooling (or the local equivalent to meet the same standard) with good grades, or show strong evidence of the ability to successfully complete the programme and progress to their chosen degree course. Students wishing to study music must provide evidence of musical ability, normally having achieved a good mark in grade VIII practical examination of the Associated Board or equivalent. Students applying for these scholarships must also have an English language level of IELTS 6.0 overall with a minimum of 5.5 in each component or equivalent.

Scholarships will be awarded on academic merit and the quality of the Scholarship statement. Please note that sponsored students are not eligible to apply.

General Information

Successful applicants will be asked to sign a formal letter of acceptance agreeing to the terms and conditions of the scholarship. They will then receive a scholarship worth £ 5,250 on their Foundation tuition fees. Upon completion and entry onto an undergraduate degree course with the Faculty of Arts & Humanities, students will receive a further £ 5,250 for the first year of their study. This will be deducted from the first year's tuition fees. Please note, the £ 500 fees discount for timely payment is not applicable for successful scholarship students.

Application procedure

Applicants must first complete an INTO University of East Anglia application form. Under Section 7 of the form applicants must tick *sponsor* and then under the following heading *Name of employee/sponsor*, applicants must write the following: 'INTO/University Scholarship 50% off Foundation tuition fees.'

Applicants should remember to clearly state which pathway they are applying for. They should then submit their completed application form, along with their academic transcripts and evidence of their current English language level.

Students should also complete the University of East Anglia Scholarship application form, including a personal statement explaining why they want to study at the University of East Anglia and how the



programme will help them in the future. The statement must be written in English and be no more than 200 words.

Deadlines for submission

27 September 2010 entry

There are two application deadlines for 27 September 2010 entry:

The first deadline is Monday 28^h June 2010. Successful students who have submitted a completed application package by this date will be notified by Monday 5th July 2010. All other scholarship applications will be retained for further consideration.

The second deadline is Friday 13th August 2010. Successful students who have submitted a completed application package by this date will be notified by Friday 27th August 2010.

11 January 2010 entry

The deadline for all applications is Friday 19th November 2010.

Successful students who have submitted a completed application package by this date will be notified by Friday 3rd December 2010.
