ARE YOU PLANNING AN EDUCATIONAL TRIP ABROAD? **HAVE YOU APPLIED FOR A TRAVEL GRANT?**

The Sir Philip Reckitt Educational Trust had another successful year in 2011 and during the year the Trustees received a record number of applications. The majority of those who applied received an award and many of these were individuals studying at either Universities or Colleges in Norfolk.

Just as a reminder to those who are interested, the aim of the Trust is to encourage individuals resident or in education in the geographic boundary of Norfolk to travel, preferably abroad, to further their interest or education. We do not fund full-time education but individuals undertaking projects or research as part of their course are welcome to apply.

Application forms for grants to travel this year can be obtained by either ringing Julie Pickering on 01508 - 518115, by fax, e-mail, by writing to the address above or by accessing our 'SPRET' Website. Applicants must clearly outline on the application form the nature of the project for which a grant is sought. There is no age limit, but applications received after 1st March will not normally be considered unless received at least six weeks prior to departure.

All applications submitted for consideration must have the backing of the Principal of the establishment at which the student normally attends or in the case of other applicants, the support of their employer or suitable referee. **This supporting letter should be forwarded** via post, fax or e-mail **with the application form** or be forwarded direct by referee. Awards will be made on a strictly individual basis so that grants are not normally made to exploration societies and expeditions as a total group.


The Trustees require a written report from those who receive grants, at the conclusion of the travel period, and it is considered reasonable to expect this to be forwarded within three months of their arrival back home. The Trustees would underline the obligation falling upon those supporting applications in this respect, as they do wish to avoid the unnecessary expense and inconvenience in 'chasing' these reports

Priority will be given to completed applications received **before 1st March**. Applicants will be advised by the end of April if their application has been successful and the amount of their award.
