American Scholarships 2015-16

The Faculty of Arts and Humanities is pleased to offer two scholarships worth £6,750 on behalf of the Memorial Trust of the 2nd Air Division USAAF.

The American Scholarships are open to American nationals registered on a postgraduate research degree course at the University.

The scholarships offer invaluable work experience because scholars support the work of the 2nd Air Division Memorial Trust by assisting staff in the Memorial Library (based in the Norfolk and Norwich Millennium Library, The Forum, Norwich) for approximately 10 hours per week over 40 weeks (400 hours in total).

The scholar's role is to give users and potential users of the Memorial Library an insight into American life and culture and to assist staff in the library in ensuring that the unique American atmosphere of the library is maintained. This may include some outreach activities.

Each scholarship provides £6,750 towards the scholar's tuition fees at UEA. It is a condition of the scholarships that the recipients agree to assist at the Memorial Library. The scholarships are tenable for one year from 1 October 2015 (renewable for a further year at the Trust's discretion).

During the Second World War nearly 7,000 young Americans, members of the 2nd Air Division of the 8th United States Army Air Force, based in Norfolk and Suffolk, lost their lives in the line of duty. The 2nd Air Division Memorial Library, through the Memorial Trust of the 2nd Air Division USAAF, has been funded largely by the 2nd Air Division Association which comprises former members of the 2nd Air Division USAAF.

The Memorial Library remains an enduring and developing connection to the United States with a lending collection of over 4,000 books covering all aspects of American life and culture, and a specialist collection (books, film, photographs, and other materials) devoted to the history of the 2nd Air Division. The Memorial Library archive at the Norfolk Record Office includes personal papers, diaries, photographs and other material relating to the USAAF servicemen who were based in Norfolk and Suffolk during the Second World War.
