

## Dr Adrian Martin, CV

I am a social scientist specialising in interdisciplinary research to inform the management of natural resources in developing countries, particularly in relation to governance of protected areas, integrated conservation and development, and environmental conflict. Recent work has pursued two main themes. Firstly, conservation and environmental justice, including the potential for deliberative approaches to achieve procedural equity and higher quality environmental decision making. Secondly, the use of ecosystem services and payments approaches to achieve more equitable distribution of the costs and benefits of biodiversity conservation. Most of my work is in Sub-Saharan Africa, with current projects including an experimental PES scheme in Rwanda, a community based REDD+ pilot in Tanzania, and support for integration of mitigation and adaptation in the Congo basin.
