NEW RESEARCH GRANTS

[Dr Arjan Verschoor](#) and [Dr Ben D'Exelle](#) have been awarded a three year ESRC grant for their work on 'Behavioural Economic Analysis of Agricultural Investment Decisions in Uganda'. A key objective of this research is to improve understanding of farmer motivation to undertake investments to raise productivity using behavioural economic research methods.

[Dr Pieter Serneels](#) has received funding from IFPRI for his role as Principal Investigator on the following research project, 'Experimental Estimates of a workplace malaria testing and treatment program on worker earnings and productivity'.

[Dr John McDonagh](#) has received funding from the African Centre for Technology Studies in Nairobi for research on 'Policy Innovation Systems for Clean Energy Security (PISCES) – Biochar Project'.
