## NEW RESEARCH GRANTS

[Dr Pieter Serneels](#) has won a Mid-Career British Academy Fellowship to do research on 'Malaria Productivity and Income: Experimental Evidence from Agricultural Workers in Nigeria'. This will run for 9 months.

[Dr Adrian Martin](#) has won ESRC funding for his 'Conservation, Markets and Justice: A Comparative Study of Local and Global Conceptions' research. This three year programme includes [Dr Thomas Sikor](#), and [Dr Bereket Kebede](#) as PIs, and [Dr Nicole Gross-Camp](#) is involved as International Development UEA (DEV) Research Fellow. The work will take place in Venezuela, Tanzania and China, and explores the conceptions of environmental justice as a means to understand tensions between biodiversity conservation and local livelihoods.

[Professor Nitya Rao](#) is external coordinator for a Ford Foundation funded UNRISD research project on 'Understanding Gender-Egalitarian Policy Change for a Post-2015 Development Agenda: A Perspective from South Asia'. This two year research will look at policy change to strengthen women's rights, and the factors and conditions under which non-state actors can trigger and influence policy change and implementation. Professor Rao will travel to a methodology workshop for this programme in August 2013.

## CONSULTANCY

[Dr Yvan Guichaoua](#) is working for the Swiss Confederation Federal Department of Foreign Affairs as a Conflict Advisor and Analyst for the Program Policy of Peace in West and Central Africa. This work involves advising personnel at a diplomatic level on the key issues associated with the conflict in the Sahel.
