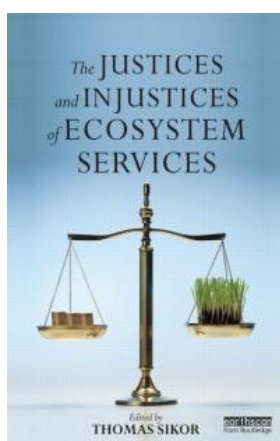

## **NEW RESEARCH GRANTS**

[Professor Thomas Sikor](#) has won an ESRC grant: 'Rethinking Environment and Development in an Era of Global Norms: An Exploration of Forests and Water in Nepal'. [Dr Mark Zeitoun](#) is a Co-Investigator. The research will examine how poor people's struggles regarding rights and access to forests and water are addressed by environmental justice systems in terms of supporting their claims on natural resources and rights to sustainable livelihoods.

[Dr Paul Clist](#) and [Dr Arjan Verschoor](#) have written a paper for DFID on 'The Conceptual Basis for Payment by Results (PBR) in International Development'. The paper will inform DFID's PBR strategy and will be published on DFID's R4D site.

[Dr Mark Zeitoun](#) is working with DEV Research Assistants on an ICRC Project: Understanding Urban Water. The work comprises a comprehensive literature review and overarching document analysing key issues affecting the provision of essential services to communities living in urban areas experiencing armed conflict, particularly focusing on water provision.
